

Contact ID (CID) Format Explained

Typical Contact ID messages will look like the following:

E13201C002 or E13201002
R13401C003 or R13401003
E40101U006 or E40101006

The message can be broken down into fields:

Event Qualifier	Event Code	Partition	Zone Qualifier	Zone/Contact/User
E	132	01	C	002
R	134	01	C	003
E	401	01	U	006

These are read as:

An event 132 was received in partition 01 in zone 002.
A restoral of event 134 was received in partition 01 in zone 003.
An event 401 was received in partition 01 by user 006.

Note: The Zone Qualifier field is not always displayed. This will not affect the meaning of the alarm message.
Note: You do not define the Zone Qualifier when defining the condition; simply leave it out.

The possible values of these fields are as follows:

<i>Event Qualifier:</i>	E - New Alarm/Event R - Restoral P - Previously reported Event
<i>Event Code:</i>	Any of the Contact ID codes – see <i>Contact ID Event Code Table</i> on <i>Dealer Literature Page</i>
<i>Partition:</i>	01 – 99
<i>Zone Qualifier:</i>	C - the three digits that follow are the Zone number U - the three digits that follow are User number
<i>Zone/Contact/User:</i>	000 – 999
